The Governing Body of St John the Baptist Primary School recognises the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities, including trips, clubs and residential experiences can make towards pupils' education.

The Governing Body aims to promote and provide such activities both as part of a broad and balanced curriculum for the pupils of the school and as additional optional activities.

Introduction

All education during school hours is free. St John the Baptist Primary school does not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the National Curriculum. This policy is based on advice from the Department for Education (DfE) on [charging for school activities](#) and [the Education Act 1996](#), sections 449 to 462 of which set out the law on charging for school activities in England.

Charges

The Governing Body reserves the right to make a charge in the following circumstances for activities organised by the school.

- The board and lodging element of approved residential activities deemed to take place in school hours (see note 1)
- Education provided outside of school time that is not part of the national curriculum or part of RE.
- Transport that is not required to take pupils to school or other premises for educational purposes
- **Leaver's hoodies**
- Any materials, books or instruments that the child or parent wishes to keep
- Music tuition (see note 2)
- **Damaged or lost items due to negligence or poor behaviour of pupils or their parents**
- **Certain Early Years Provision (see note 3)**

When organising school trips or visits which enrich the curriculum and educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to provide a voluntary contribution to the rest of the trip. The contributions are kept very low and heavily subsidised by school. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, it may become necessary to cancel a trip. However, if a trip goes ahead, it may include children whose parents have not paid any contribution. These children are not treated differently from any others.

School pays additional costs in order to support the visit. Parents have a right to know how each trip is funded and this information will be provided in the school trip letter.

The following is a list of additional activities organised by the school, which require voluntary contributions from parents. These activities are:

- Visits to museums
- Sporting activities which require transport costs
- Outdoor adventure activities
- Visits to the theatre

- School trips
- Musical events

Swimming

The school organises swimming lessons for children in Key Stage 2. These take place in school time and are part of the National Curriculum. No charge is made for this activity. Parents are informed when these lessons are to take place. The provider may request that swimmers wear a swimming hat. These are not provided by Tees Active or the school.

Charging in Kind

The Governing Body reserves the right to ask for voluntary contributions for ingredients and materials where appropriate if they are to be eaten or used by the children.

School Trip Refunds

Should your child not attend a trip either in the event that the school has to cancel a trip due to foreseen circumstances, or is cancelled by a party other than the school due to unforeseen circumstances, it is at the school's discretion as to whether a refund is given to parents. The school will deal with cancellations and refunds on a case-by-case basis, ensuring that all pupils and their families are treated equally.

Equal Opportunities

In accordance with Equality Act 2010 there is no discrimination against anyone, be they staff or pupil, on the grounds of their age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage or civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, sexual orientation.

Freedom of Information

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) gives rights of public access to information held by public authorities.

Public authorities can charge for the reasonable costs it expects to incur in:

- contacting the applicant to inform them the requested information is held (even if the information will not be provided),
- and communicating the information to the applicant.

This includes, but is not limited to, the costs of:

- reproducing any document containing the information e.g., printing or photocopying;
- postage and other forms of transmitting the information; and complying with section 11 FOIA where the applicant has expressed a preference for the means of communication and where this is reasonably practicable.

Note 1

Residential visits

If the school organises a residential visit in school time or mainly school time, which is to provide education directly related to the National Curriculum, we do not make any charge for the education. However, we may make a charge to cover the costs of board, lodging and travel expenses.

Note 2

Music Tuition

All children study music as part of the normal school curriculum and there is no charge for this. There is however a charge for individual or group music tuition if this is not part of the National Curriculum. The peripatetic music teachers teach individual or small group lessons which are charged for by the provider. If parents are experiencing financial difficulty, they should come and talk to the Headteacher. Any information regarding music tuition will be shared fully with parents before the lessons take place.

Note 3

Early Years Provision

Any child who stays for a school meal during their 15 or 30 hours will be charged the cost of that meal. If you are entitled to Free School Meals then please contact the school office to apply for FSM BEFORE your child stays for a meal, otherwise, they will be charged at the standard school meal daily rate. Parents may wish to provide a packed lunch for their children for those times, and a meal will be provided at all times should a parent not provide one.

All Early Years pupils will experience trips and visits and are subject to the same voluntary charges for those.
